|  | NORTH ZONE <br> On the North Zone of the fire today, activity was moderated due to early humidity in the thirties before it dropped later in the afternoon. There was slight progresson of the fire towards the northeast near Cattle Mountain, but it did not cause an increase in acreage of the fire. Fire activity will be present in Chetwood Creek, Norris Lake, East Fore Chiquito, and Northeast of Little Shuteye Peak, and south of Whisky Falls. <br> Fire resources on the North Zone will remain committed to improving containment line utilizing heavy equipment and handcrews where bulldozers are unable to make access. There have also been preparations to ensure threatened structure are protected. <br> SOUTH ZONE <br> Today on the South Zone of the Creek Fire there was active fire on the eastern portion of the zone towards the 80 Road and Potter Pass. A spot fire occurred south of China Peak that threatens containment and may progress east towards the Dinkey Lakes Wilderness. Once the fire moves into sparser fuels progression will slow as it moves into the Ansel Adams Wilderness. There may be a planned firing operation along Kaiser Pass Road which will cause visible smoke to rise within the fire area. <br> Operationally, fire resources will perform tactical patrol near the fire perimeter mopping up hot spots and ensuring structures are prepared for defense in the event the fire approaches communities. Containment remains a priority, and handcrews will be deployed in areas where heavy equipment (i.e. bulldozers) cannot be utilized due to challenging terrain. <br> WEATHER INFORMATION <br> A significant shift in weather occurred today. Downslope and downcanyon winds that began midday brought drier air with reduced humidities and poorer moisture recovery. Combined with increasing temperatures through midweek, there will be increase fire behavior in all areas of the fire as fuels are able to preheat earlier in the day and hot spots will show more open flame and smoke. <br> Tomorrow, the temperatures and humidity at dawn will be similar to that of conditions present late today. Fire resoures will be patrolling and mopping up in all areas of the fire as part of their tactical patrols and efforts to fully contain the Creek Fire. |

| National Forest Closures | The USDA Forest Service Pacific Southwest Region announces increased access to some National Forests in California beginning at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 19, 2020. <br> Nine National Forests in California remain closed: Angeles NF, Cleveland NF, Los Padres NF, Inyo NF, Klamath NF, San Bernardino NF, Sequoia NF, Sierra NF, and Six Rivers NF. This decision will continue to be reviewed daily with evolving fire and weather conditions. <br> Nine other National Forests may open to varying degrees. Visitors should contact the following National Forests for more information on their status: Eldorado NF, Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit, Lassen NF, Mendocino NF, Modoc NF, Plumas NF, Shasta-Trinity NF, Stanislaus NF, and the Tahoe NF. These forests will implement their own forest orders that will either limit dispersed use or provide for area closures around fires. <br> Conditions can change quickly. Therefore, we emphasize that all citizens heed local announcements for changes in conditions and potential evacuations. <br> For additional questions, please contact your National Forest. |

| Evacuation Zones | Following are written descriptions of Fresno County Evacuation Zones |
| Evacuation Zones: <br> Warnings are indicated by yellow | Fresno County <br> Zone F5B: The south boundary is Burrough Valley Road between Tollhouse Road to the west and Burrough North Road to the east. The zone extends northeast and ends just south of Hidden Hollow Lane. The west boundary consists of the east side of Tollhouse Road |
| Evacuation Zones: <br> Orders are indicated by red | Fresno County <br> Zone F1K: South boundary is the dead end of Burrough Mountain Road. West boundary is Tollhouse Rock, north boundary is the intersection of Tollhouse Road and Burrough Mountain Road. East boundary is the excludes the west properties located off of Fire Road. <br> Zone F1M: South boundary is at the southern extension of properties off of Natoma Road. West boundary is the intersection of Tollhouse Road and Shaver Springs Road. |

North boundary is the intersection of Highway 168 and Tollhouse Road (Includes both sides of Tollhouse Road). East boundary is the intersection of Peterson Road and Cripe Road.
Zone F1N: South boundary is the intersection of Sycamore Creek and Vincent Fire Road. The west boundary consists of (including) the west properties off of Fire and Cripe Road. The north boundary is the intersection of Tollhouse Road and Cressman Road. The east boundary is the intersection of Cressman Road and Glenwood lane, as well as the area west of 37887 Peterson Road.
Zone F1O: The south boundary extends to the end of properties located south of Peterson Road. The west boundary begins at 37887 Peterson Road. The north and east boundaries are the intersection of Peterson Road and James Mountain Road.
Zone F2L: South boundary contains the properties on both sides of Sweet Grass Street. West boundary extends to contain all properties west of the Highway 168 north of the Shaver Post Office and south of Ken's Market (42137 Tollhouse Road).
Zone F6B; South and west boundary is just east of the Vincent Fire Road and Bob's Flat Trail intersection. The boundary expands to the north to include a largely undeveloped portion which includes the Vincent Fire Road, south of Burrough Mountain Road. The east boundary is about a half a mile west of Cole Spring.
Zone F6G: South Boundary is just north of the Dinkey-Trimmer Road and Ross Crossing Road intersection. West Boundary is a half a mile west of the Big Creek Road and Vomac Clovis Drive intersection. The north boundary is a mile north of the Nutmeg Campground (off of Big Creek Road). East boundary contains Dinkey Trimmer Road. Zone F7D: Contains both sides of Huntington Lake Road, east of it's intersection with Old Railroad Grade Road, and west of it's intersection with Camp Sierra Road. The zone extends north to exclude the properties off of Stump Springs Road. The east boundary ends west of the Big Creek Fire Station.
Zone F7E: This zone contains Big Creek and the Big Creek Edison Hydroelectric Plant. The south boundary consists of both sides of Huntington Lake Road from Camp Sierra Road to Stump Springs Road in the north.
Zone F7G: South boundary contains the north side of Huntington Lake Road and extends to the west to the San Joaquin River. The north boundary is Dam Six Lake and is a half a mile west of the intersection of Huntington Lake Road and Camp Sierra Road.
Zone F9A: The south and west boundary lays just north of Dinkey Creek. The west boundary continues north to contain both sides of Rock Creek Road until just south of the "Brewer Lake Trail Turnoff". The north boundary is just north of Foster Ridge as well as the Dinkey Lakes Trailhead.
Zone F9B: The south boundary is south of the intersection of Tollhouse Road and Flintridge Ave. The west boundary lays east of Big Creek, and includes "Camp Keola" to the north. The north boundary contains the south shore of Huntington Lake at the end of Huntington Lodge Road. The east boundary lays about a quarter of a mile west of Camp Kern.
Zone F9C: The west boundary lays west of Camp Kern. The north boundary includes the south shore of Huntington Lake. The east boundary lays west of China Peak Mountain Resort, and contains "Chinese Peak" to the south.
Zone F9D: The west boundary lays west of Gold Arrow Camp. This zone contains China Peak Mountain Resort, as well as Indian Pools Trail. The north boundary contains the northeast shoreline of Huntington Lake, and includes the huntington Boat Ramp Launch


|  | Zone F10E: The south boundary is the National Forest, north of Muir Trail Ranch. the west boundary is west of Florence Lake and west of Jackass Dike. The north boundary is south of Edison Lake as well as the National Forest. The east boundary is the National Forest, west of Mount Seneger and Seven Gables. <br> Zone F11A: The south boundary includes the end of Huntington Lodge Road as well as properties that lay south of the intersection of Huntington Lake Road and Black Point Road. The west boundary lays just east of Mushroom Rock. The north boundary includes properties off of Huntington Lake Road from its intersection with Black Point Road to Huntington Lake Road's intersection with Bear Creek Tract. The east boundary includes the north shoreline of Huntington lake until (excluding) Bear Creek Tract. <br> Zone F11B: The south boundary begins at the fork of Kaiser Pass Road with the dirt road leading northwest to the Rattlesnake Trailhead. The west boundary lays just east of Upper Twin Lakes. The north boundary lays south of Mount Tom. The east boundary lays about a half-mile northeast of Sample Meadow Campground, and about threequarters of a mile west of Camp Sixty-One D Campground. <br> Zone F11C: The south boundary includes both sides of Stump Springs Road. The west boundary is the San Joaquin River. The north boundary is south of the intersection of Stump Springs Road and Camp Creek. The east boundary lays just east of the intersection of Huntington Lake Road and Stump Springs Road. The boundary ends (excludes) just west of Black Point Road, and just east of Mushroom Rock. This zone includes both Nellie Lake and Bishop of Tralee Park. <br> Zone F11D: This zone contains the predominately wilderness that lays north of Huntington Lake. The south boundary begins near the end of the developments of Lakeshore. The west boundary lays just east of Nellie Lake. The north boundary is about one mile north of Long Lake. The east boundary is at Potter Pass as well as just west of Potter Creek to the south of this zone. <br> Zone F11E: South boundary consists of Stump Springs Road, north of Saddle Creek. West boundary is the San Joaquin River. North boundary is south of Mill Creek. <br> Zone F11F: Zone includes the Mount Tom Area, and moves out west to the San Joaquin River. <br> Zone F12A: Contains wilderness land south of Cockscomb and Pincushion Peak, north of Edison Lake. <br> Zone F12B: Zone contains Pincushion Peak, Cockscomb, Silver Peak, Graveyard Peak, and Double Peak East. |

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| Fresno County <br> Resources: | Fresno County: <br> The County of Fresno has opened a multi-agency Local Assistance Center (LAC) at the Clovis Veterans Memorial District located at $8084^{\text {th }}$ Street, Clovis, CA 93612 to support residents impacted by the Creek Fire as part of the ongoing recovery process. <br> The LAC will be open seven days a week from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. until further notice. This center will serve as a one-stop shop to help connect residents and property owners with assistance and resources available through a variety of state and local agencies.
