	Dixie Fire East Zone: As predicted, thunderstorm cells moved into the area and the outflow of air created erratic winds and strong gusts. In combination with high temperatures and clear skies, the fire was very active at Keddie Point, Dyer Mountain, and pushed South and East at Wilcox Valley. Air support consisted of fixed wing aircraft in Wilcox Valley and rotary around Dyer Mountain. Unstable atmospheric conditions are anticipated to remain overnight.
