CURRENT SITUATION

<p>WEST ZONE</p> <p>Situation Summary:</p> <p>Incident Information:</p> 	<p>Poor overnight RH recovery allowed for active fire behavior in some areas. Fuels continued to smolder and creep away from control lines. Large diameter dead and down fuels continued to smolder and burn. Steep and rugged terrain and critically dry fuel conditions have presented control challenges, slowing the construction of direct line in some areas. Firefighters will work diligently as more warm weather, southwest winds, and low humidity are expected over the next few operational periods. Crews will continue work along the northeast and southern edge of the fire perimeter mopping up and building more control line. Damage inspections is complete with 3,356 structures assessed.</p> <p>To better provide public and firefighter safety due to extreme fire conditions throughout Northern California, and strained firefighter resources throughout the country, the USDA Forest Service Pacific Southwest Region is announcing a temporary closure of all National Forests in California. 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<p>EAST ZONE SITUATION SUMMARY:</p>	<p>Winds last night were calm and out of the east, with occasional gusts to 15-20 mph. Firefighters continued to mop up and patrol the fire perimeter, especially in areas with any remaining hot spots or uncontained edges. Firefighters continued to ensure that the fire remained in its current footprint. Hose lines were pulled from contained sections of the fireline that have been patrolled heavily in recent days and have shown no heat or movement. In the Margret Lake area there was no forward progression of the fire overnight.</p> <p>Today, line construction and mop up will continue on uncontained fire edges northwest of Caples Lake, on the east side of Trimmer Peak as well as on the isolated heat in and near Desolation Wilderness.</p>

<p>EVACUATIONS EL DORADO COUNTY</p>	<p><u>EL DORADO COUNTY – ORDERS</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CALDOR - East of North South Road, West of Service Road 09N78A, north of the Middle Fork of the Cosumnes River, south of Caldor • CAPLES CREEK - This section is south of Highway 50 east of Kyburz up to 41 Milestone Tract and south all the way to Highway 88 between 1 mile east of Mormon Emigrant Trail up to Caples Lake following the County Line. • CRYSTAL BASIN B - North of Highway 50, east of Ice House Road to Wrights Lake Road up to the Placer County Line to include Ice House Reservoir, Wrights Lake, and Loon Lake. • DESOLATION - This section extends south of the Placer County Line in the area of the Rubicon Trail between Spider Lake and Sourdough Hill and extends south into Desolation Wilderness all the way to Highway 50 to include the areas of Rockbound Lake, Rubicon Reservoir, Highland Lake, Horseshoe Lake, Schmidell Lake and Twin Lakes south to Highway 50 between Wrights Lake Road and Twin Bridges. The eastern edge of this area is in line with Clyde Lake and Pyramid Lake.

- **DESOLATION EAST** - The area north of Echo Lake, following the Desolation Wilderness north staying west of Fallen Leaf Lake, Cascade Lake and Emerald Bay up to the Placer County Line
- **DESOLATION NORTH** - This is the area of Desolation Wilderness south of the Placer County Line extending to Emerald Bay but staying within Desolation Wilderness.
- **GRIZZLY FLAT PROPER** - The community of Grizzly Flats remains closed, with access via permit only. South of the intersection of Cosumnes Mine Road and Sciaroni Road, north and east of the intersection of Grizzly Flat Road and Blue Mountain Road, west of the intersection of Capps Crossing Road and Cypress Point Drive.
- **HEAVENLY** - The entire Heavenly property and lands, extending northeast to the Alpine County Line and to the Nevada State line.
- **HELL HOLE** - Northeast of Highway 89, west of the Alpine County line, and south of Tahoe Paradise Golf Course.
- **MET TO HWY 88** - South of Mormon Emigrant Trail to Highway 88. West on Highway 88 to Hams Station.
- **NORTH ECHO** - North of Highway 50 between Twin Bridges and Echo Summit, extending to the north just past Upper Echo Lake.
- **SOUTH ECHO** - South of Highway 50 starting at Camp Sacramento to the top of Echo Summit then proceeding due south to the Alpine County Line.
- **TRIMMER** - The area east of Pioneer Trail to the Alpine County Line stopping south of Heavenly Ski Resort, excluding all residences off Pioneer Trail.
- **US 50 SOUTH TO KYBURZ** - South of Highway 50 from Ice House Road to Silver Fork Road, to include the community of Kyburz, excluding the area south of the south fork of the American River. East of Mormon Emigrant Trail to Highway 88.

EL DORADO COUNTY - WARNINGS:

- **CRYSTAL BASIN A** - West of Ice House Road from the Placer County Line, south to Highway 50 and east of Junction Reservoir.
- **CHRISTMAS VALLEY** - All residences accessed from Highway 89 south of Highway 50 in Meyers through Christmas Valley and including all of South Upper Truckee.
- **FALLEN LEAF B** - West side of highway 89 from the city limits through Emerald Bay. This area includes Fallen Leaf Road stopping at Tahoe Mountain Road, and all of Cathedral.
- **FALLEN LEAF C** - The area of Fallen Leaf Road from Tahoe Mountain Road into the end of Fallen Leaf Road. The privately owned residences are open to be occupied under this warning. The US Forest Service permitted residences must get an exemption permit from the US Forest Service prior to returning and that will likely be in the form of a day pass only.
- **GREATER GRIZZLY EAST** - South of Mormon Emigrant Trail, west of North South Road, north of Omo Ranch Road, east of the intersection of Omo Ranch and Slug Gulch Road, south of the Community of Blue Mountain, east of the intersection of Capps Crossing Road and Cypress Point Road.
- **HAPPY VALLEY** - All properties accessed from Happy Valley Road.
- **MEYERS** - All residences in Meyers north of Highway 89 and east of Highway 50 to include all streets accessed from Apache, Mandan, following Pioneer Trail northeast just past Elks Club.
- **PI PI** - East of North South Road from Omo Ranch to Cat Creek and east to Highway 88 1 mile east of Omo Ranch Road.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PIONEER - All homes accessed from both sides of Pioneer Trail from the city limits starting at Al Tahoe Blvd and moving west stopping before Elks Club. • SOUTHEAST POLLOCK - North of Park Creek Road to Highway 50, east Fresh Pond to Ice House Road. Due south from Ice House to the intersection of Mormon Emigrant Trail Intersection and west along Mormon Emigrant Trail Intersection to the Park Creek Mormon Emigrant Trail Intersection. • WASHOE MEADOWS / NORTH UPPER TRUCKEE - All streets accessed from North Upper Truckee Road which is north of Highway 50 stopping at Sawmill and Lake Tahoe Blvd on the north side. This includes all residences on Sawmill and the residences to the west of Highway 50 in Meyers to include Country Club, Bakersfield, East S and Hopi. • THE FOLLOWING STREETS IN EL DORADO COUNTY - Grizzly Flat Road between Steely Ridge Road and Blue Mountain Road. Cosumnes Mine Road between String Canyon Road and the North Fork of the Cosumnes River. String Canyon Road between Grizzly Flat Road and Eagle Hill Road. West of Forestdale Road and south to the Pacific Crest Trail Crossing. West of the Pacific Crest Trail to the Summit City Canyon Trail. West of Summit City Canyon Trail and south to the El Dorado/Stanislaus National Forest Line. El Dorado/Stanislaus National Forest Line west to the Alpine/Amador County Line. • ZONE 20 - Highway 89 south, from Luther Pass Road to the Pickett's Junction (Highway 88). West on Highway 88 to Kirkwood. South to include Kirkwood Ski Resort and Caples Lake. <p><u>ALPINE EVACUATION WARNINGS:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ZONE 21A - The area from Pickett's Junction, north on Highway 89 the Alpine/El Dorado County Line. Southwest along Horse Thief Canyon to Pickett's Junction. • ZONE 22A - The area from Armstrong Ridge at the Alpine/El Dorado County Line, northeast to the California/Nevada State Line. Southeast along the Alpine County Line to Fay-Luther Canyon. Southwest along Fay-Luther Canyon to the Horse Thief Canyon to Armstrong Ridge. Northwest on Armstrong Ridge to the Alpine/El Dorado County Line. • ZONE 23 - East of Forestdale Road and south to the Pacific Crest Trail Crossing.
